- Enter C4S Services in CompuClaim.
- Consult services are an integral part or an extension of a direct medical service but are not separately reimbursable.
- Service comments must include enough detail to allow reconstruction of what transpired for each service.
- C4S treatment services are reportable if the student has a Plan of Care.

97166 GOHA	OT Evaluation moderate complexity, 45 min <u>History</u> - An occupational profile and medical and therapy history, which includes an expanded brief review of medical and/or therapy records and additional review of physical, cognitive, or psychosocial history related to current functional performance <u>Examination</u> - An assessment(s) that identifies 3-5 performance deficits (i.e., relating to physical, cognitive, or psychosocial skills) that result in the activity limitations and/or participation restrictions <u>Decision Making</u> - Clinical decision making of moderate analytic complexity, which includes an analysis of the occupational profile, analysis of data from detailed assessment(s), and consideration of several treatment options. Patient may present with comorbidities that affect occupational performance. Minimal to moderate modification of tasks or assistance (e.g., physical or verbal) with assessment(s) is necessary to enable patient to complete evaluation component. Typically, 45 minutes are spent face-to-face with the patient and/or family	NO
97167 GOHA	OT Evaluation high complexity, 60 min <u>History</u> - An occupational profile and medical and therapy history, which includes an expanded brief review of medical and/or therapy records and extensive additional review of physical, cognitive, or psychosocial history related to current functional performance <u>Examination</u> - An assessment(s) that identifies 5 or more performance deficits (i.e., relating to physical, cognitive, or psychosocial skills) that result in the activity limitations and/or participation restrictions <u>Decision Making</u> - Clinical decision making of high analytic complexity, which includes an analysis of the occupational profile, analysis of data from detailed assessment(s), and consideration of several treatment options. Patient presents with comorbidities that affect occupational performance. Significant modification of tasks or assistance (e.g., physical or verbal) with assessment(s) is necessary to enable the patient to complete evaluation component. Typically, 60 minutes are spent face-to-face with the patient and/or family	NO
